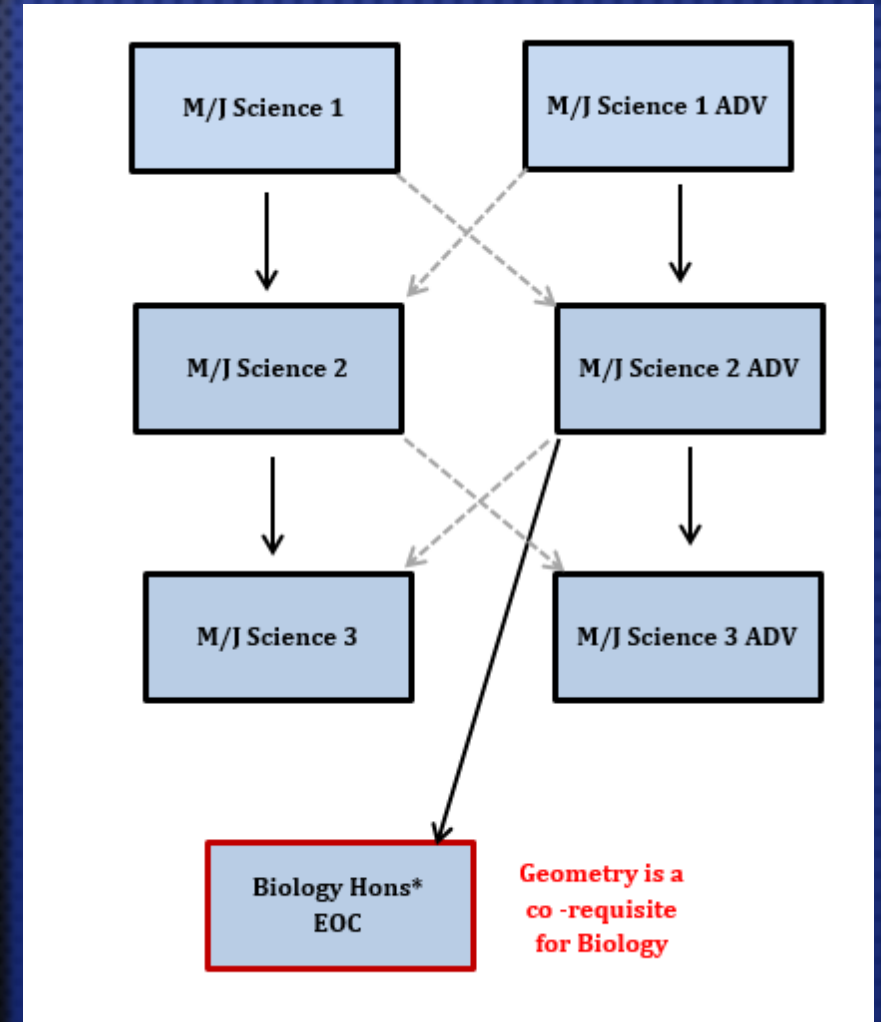
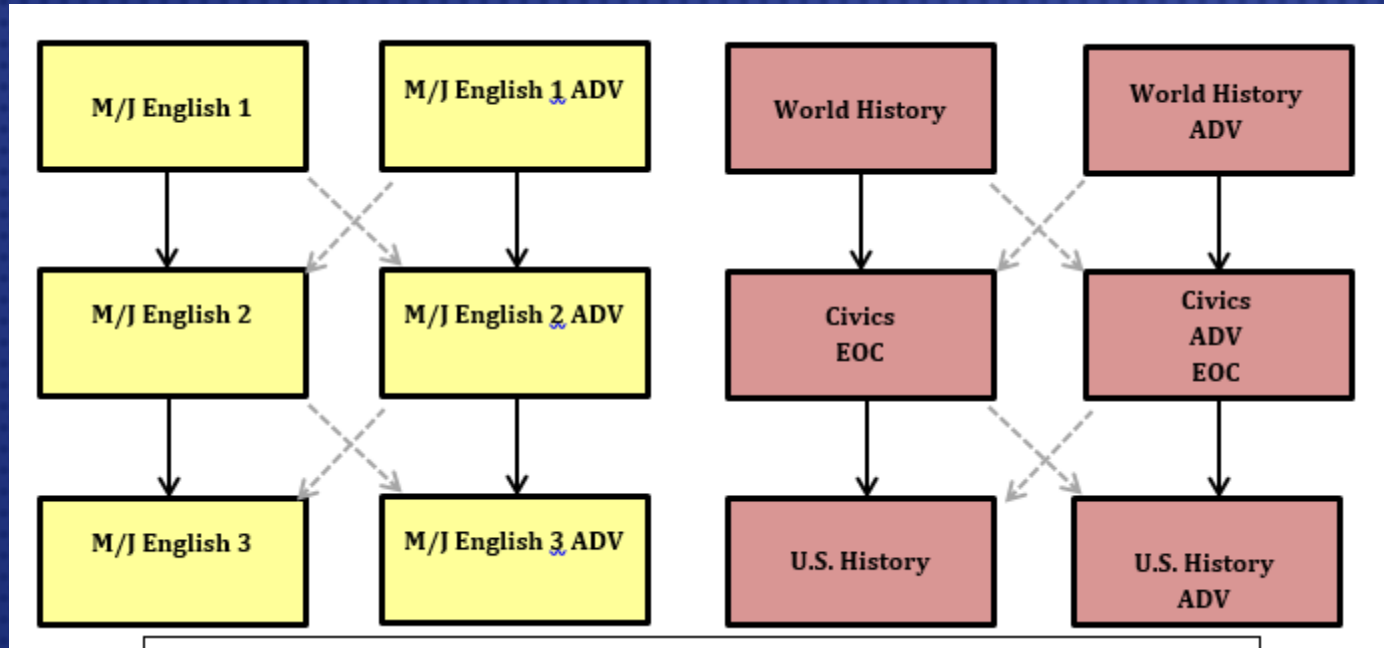

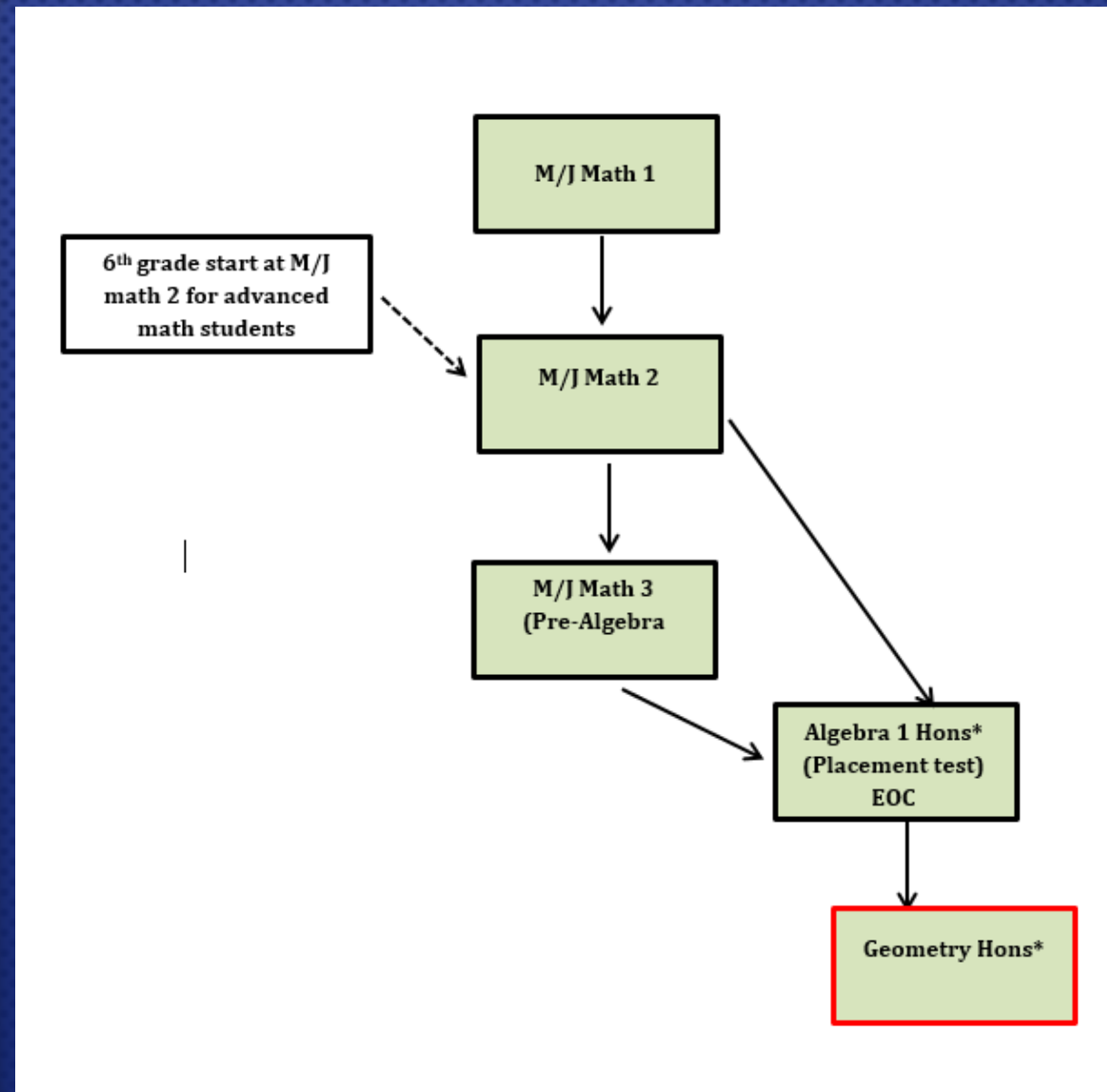
SCHEDULE

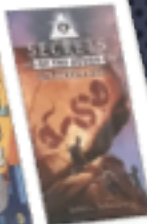

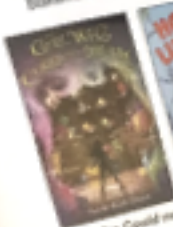

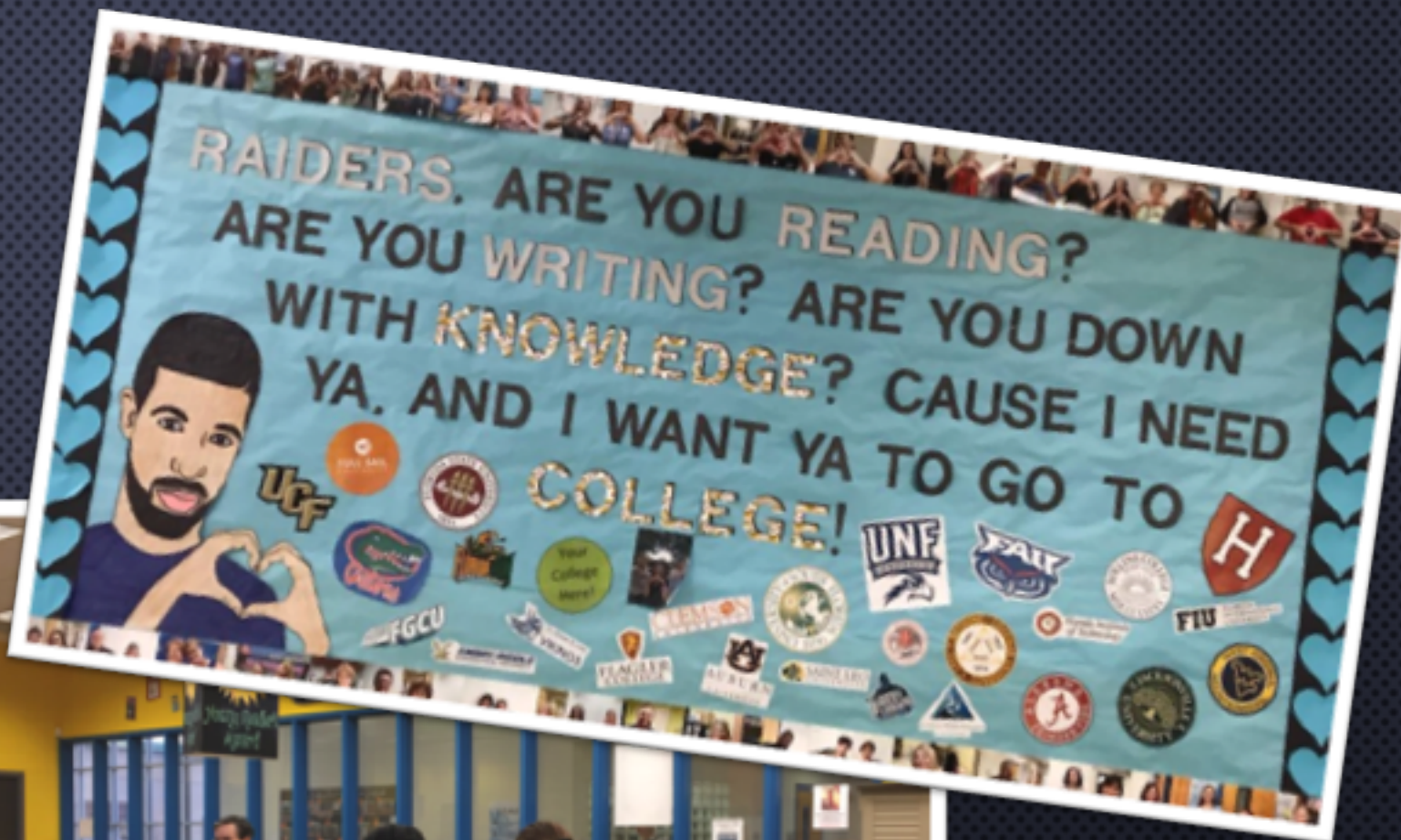
